WORLD SERIES RESUME

BROWNS TAKE OPENER

The Browns won their first Series ball game by beating the St. Louis Cardinals' finest pitcher, Mort Cooper by a 2-1 score in an errorless game and in spite of one of Coopers most brilliant performances.

Mc Quinn's homer settled down Galehouse's pitching who hurled air tight ball until the ninth. All in all he struck out five, walked four and held the Cards' power boys—Stan Musial, Walker Cooper, Whitey Kurowski and Dan Litwhiler to a pair of singles by Musial and Kurowski.

Musial picked up the first hit of the series after Cooper retired Don Gutteridge and fanned Kreevich and Laabs. In the next inning Marion lined the first of his doubles down the left field line and when Verban hit a sharp one back of second that Gutteridge stopped. Marion took third. Mort Cooper missed a third Strike.

The third inning found the Cards looking dangerous — Hopp singled over Mc Quinn's head and Ray Sanders followed with a bingle to right. Luke Sewell called for an intentional pass to Walker Cooper after Musial laid down a neat sacrifice and both runners advanced. Bases were loaded and one out, but Galehouse struck out Kurowski, and Litwhiler rolled to Christman at third for a force play on Sanders.

Moore's liner to right field gave the Browns their first hit of the Series. Mc Quinn after ignoring a high pitch met Coopers next offering and sent it into the left field stands for his 12th home run of the year.

Marion opened the ninth with a smash that Kreevich tried to spear but missed and Marion pulled up safe at second base. Marion took third as Bergamo grounded out. Ken O'Dea batting for Donnelly drove a long fly ball to Kreevich. Marion scoring. For the final out of the ball game Hopp sent Kreevich back to the fench to pull in a long fly ball.

THIRD GAME TO BROWNS BY 6-2 COUNT

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 6th. Big Jack Kramer built a pretty strong prop under the Brown's world championship hopes when he rationed 7 hits and pitched the Browns to a 6-2 win.

In the third inning, the Browns really came to life with disastrous results for Ted Wilks, the Card's rookie pitching wonder, with three Cardinal freshmen checking in at the pitchers box.

In the second, Wilks loaded the bases on walks, escaping only by fanning pitcher Kramer. He opened the third by striking out Don Gutteridge. Stephens, McQuinn, Dan Zarilla and Mark Christman followed with singles after Gene Moore

lined a hit to the right, and that finished Wilks.

Freddy Schmidt took over and loaded the bases, but with the count two and two on Kramer, Schmidt cut loose with a low wild pitch that allowed Zarilla to score the 4th run.

Batting as the visiting team, the Cardinals had picked up a run in the first half inning. Hopp started it with one out when Stephens let a roller through for a two-base error. After Stan Musial popped to short, Walker Cooper drove one for a single, scoring Hopp. Kurowski fell victim to the first of Kramer's 10 strikeouts.

Redbird rookie Al Jurisich hurled

in the seventh and Gutteridge took a double. Jurisich got rid of Kreevich and Moore, while Gutteridge went to third, but the fourth ball to Stephens eluded Cooper and another run was over. McQuinn drove in Stephens with a line drive two-bagger.

In the eighth and ninth, the Cards couldn't reach Kramer. Hopp slapped a hit to center to set the mood for an uprising in the eighth. When Cooper stepped into a curve, Zarilla got his throw away fast and Hopp had to hold third. The gentleman from New Orleans hit the corner for a called third strike when Sanders took a three and two pitch, and Kurowski's best effort was a long drive to Moore

RESUME OF PLAY

1st. Inning

CARDS : Litwhiler struck out. Hopp beats out sharp grounder which Gutteridge knocks down. Musial hits first pitch on roof of right field stands for a homer scoring Hopp before him. Cooper bounces out pitcher to first. Sanders called out on strikes.

Two Hits, two Runs

BROWNS : Gutteridge struck out. Kreevich singled to left, in front of Litwhiler, who tried for a shoe string catch. Moore sends Hopp very deep into right center for a long out as Hopp crashed into the wall for a great catch. Stephens rolls out Marion to Sanders.

One hit, no runs.

2nd Inning

CARDS : Sanders flied out to Kreevich. Stephens throws out both Marion and Verban.

No hits, no runs.

BROWNS : Laabs flies to Litwhiler. McQuinn singles to left. Christman lines a single to right center and McQuinn beats throw to third. Marion to Verban to Sanders.

Two hits, no runs.

3rd Inning

CARDS : Brecheen looks at the third strike. Litwhiler singles off of Stephens' glove. Hopp fans. Musial beats out slow roller to second. Cooper singles to left, scoring Litwhiler. Sanders grounded through Gutteridge's legs for an error. Musial scoring. Kurowski rolls out Stephens to McQuinn. 3 hits, 2 runs.

BROWNS : Gutteridge singles to center. Kreevich flies to Litwhiler. Moore strikes-out.

One hit, no runs.

4th Inning

CARDS : Hollingsworth pitching for Browns. Marion out second to first. Verban flies out to Kreevich. Brecheen out Kurowski to Sanders.

No hits, no runs.

BROWNS : Stephens out, pitcher to first. Laabs singles to center. McQuinn rolls out pitcher to first. Christman takes third strike.

One hit, no runs.

5th Inning

CARDS : Litwhiler out, Stephens to McQuinn. Hopp flies to Laabs. Musial walks, but Cooper forces Musial, Stephens to Gutteridge.

No hits, no runs.

BROWNS : Hayworth pops to Sanders. Hollingsworth grounds out to Sanders. Gutteridge singles to left. Kreevich out Brecheen to Sanders.

One hit, no runs.

6th Inning

CARDS : Sanders singles over second. Kurowski fans. Marion doubles off of Laab's glove to the left field fence, scoring Sanders. Verban lines out to Kreevich. Brecheen out pitcher to first.

Two hits, one run.

BROWNS : Hopp takes Moore's and Stephen's flies for outs. Laabs doubles as Litwhiler missed shoe string catch. McQuinn walks on a 3 and 2 count. Christman forces McQuinn, Kurowski to Verban.

One hit, no runs.

7th Inning

CARDS : Litwhiler singles to center, as Kreevich missed hard catch. Litwhiler out Laabs to Stephens in attempt to stretch single to double. Hopp singled to left. Musial doubled to left, Hopp advancing to third. Cooper passed inten-

Some 35,076 who sat through 11 innings of perfect baseball weather left Sportsman Park raving about the feats of young Blix Donnelly and veteran Ken O'Dea. After Max Lanier was pulled in the eighth it was Donnelly who throttled the Browns. O'Dea batting for Emil Verban in the eleventh drove a line drive into right field scoring Ray Sanders with the winning run.

It was Donnelly that toyed with the Browns' batters until the

eleventh, Bob Muncrief, who repiaced Nelson Potter in the seventh was able to match him. Sanders singled in the eleventh over second for his first hit of the day. Whitey Kurowski laid down a sacrifice bunt and Luke Sewell called for a pass to Marty Marion. O'Dea went up to swing for Verban and plunked the Redbirds' seventh hit of the day into right field, sending Sanders across ending the extra-inning Series game.
