The Browns won their first Series ball game by beating the St. Louis Cardinal's finest pitcher, Mort Cooper by a 2-1 score in an errorless game and in spite of one of Coopers most brilliant performances.

Mc Quinn's homer settled down Galehouse's pitching who hurled air tight ball until the ninth. All in all he struck out five, walked four and held the Cards' power boys-Stan Musial, Walker Cooper, Whitey Kurowski and Dan Litwhiler to a pair of singles by Musial and Kurowski

Musial picked up the first hit of the series after Cooper retired Don Gutteridge and fanned Kreevich and Laabs. In the next inning Marion lined the first of his doubles down the left field line and when Verban hit a sharp one back of second that Gutteridge stopped. Marion took third.
