### SUPERFORTS CONCENTRATE ON SMALLER INDUSTRIES

Four--hundred--fifty American Superfortresses yesterday dropped 3,000 tons of fire bombs on four of Japan's smaller industrial centers. It's considered that Japan's major industrial cities are out of action for the time being.

Also striking at the home islands of Japan was a carrier--task force of the British Pacific Fleet which had shelled and bombed the Japanese naval base of Truk. In day and night attacks on Thursday and Friday, it struck at airfields, docks and coast defenses. The Japanese say that Allied warships have again shelled Mat-suwa in the Northern Kuriles.

It Gen Wade H. Haislip, new Seventh Army commander, presented the Medal of Honor to Sgt Coolidge and reviewed the troops with him.

Sgt Coolidge received this award for his "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at risk of his life, above and beyond the call of duty on October 24-27, 1944. At that time the Battalion was fighting against stiff opposition in the Demanalie de Champ Forest, seven miles Southeast of St. Die.

This is now the second Congressional Medal of Honor awarded to a member of this Battalion. The first one was to T/Sgt Logan of "L" Company.
